- Sexual violence
- Dating violence
- Abuse or exploitation of an elderly person or disabled adult



A Hope Card will then be issued by your Clerk of Court in three (3) business days.

Hope Cards are valid for two years after the issuance date of a final order or the expiration date of the injunction, whichever comes first.
